The Problem stated by Andrea Silva:

#ask #directmail #covid19 I have finally finished writing this appeal and gotten all my letterhead and printer set up. Time keeps on slipping out of my grasp while launching weekly virtual events, canceling the gala and designing this new appeal.

In the essence of time, I'm posting the letter here for any and all feedback. Happy to provide additional background information if it helps. Thanks in advance for your help! #crisisappeal #comms

Simple Recommendations:

- 1. I'm a trained copywriter, and I follow "The Power of One" religiously. Tell One good story that Inspires One Simple Action.
 - In your case, you had the perfect story to tell. Umme's experience ties in directly with the reason you're writing. Awesome. So I highlighted that by indenting it.
- 2. Get specific about how much you need to raise. You cancelled the event. How much would you have made, or will lose? Fill in the \$XXX

- 3. I cut out some of the red herrings. They may be good points on their own, but don't add to the strength of this letter.
- 4. You can make the letter longer by adding some 'social proof' elements. Get quotes from your two honorees about why you rock and what your program means to them.

OR

Get quotes from other sponsors about the same thing.

Either way, put them in AFTER the story, and before the final ask.

5. Please don't mail that Impact Report with this letter. Just the words "... on page 12..." made me feel bad for your donors. Why you wanna' give them homework? Always remember... make it eaaasssyyy.

LIFT NOTE #1 RECOMMENDATION: Only mail this if necessary. This is a distraction and has nothing to do with your appeal.

(This copy was in the original letter shown at the end of this document. I took it out of the letter completely because it distracts from the goal.

However, many nonprofits have more people to consider when sending an appeal than the copywriter. This story could work as a buck slip. It would work even better if the note were written by the State Representative himself.

I still vote for leaving it out. There are other more effective messages that could be used in place of this story.)

Don't forget to register for your mail-in ballot by May 26!

LIFT NOTE #2 RECOMMENDATION: I recommend leaving technical documents out of donor-centered letters and emails unless absolutely necessary.

"You mentioned an Impact Report...

Please, don't include an impact report in this package. Don't include one in any package. Donors don't care, won't read it, and will likely depress potential gifts.

Instead, if you're really proud of it, put it online and offer a link in the letter or email towards the end, or right before the final ask - "...If you'd like more information about how this crisis is affecting Citizen Diplomacy, you can read our Impact Report here."
